- 3 women are killed in Domestic Violence situations every fortnight across Australia.
- It is estimated that every year, 350,000 and 125,000 women and girls will experience physical and sexual violence respectively.
- 95% of domestic violence involves a male perpetrator and a female victim. The other 5% includes same sex relationships or a female perpetrator to the victim (Courtesy of the "Don't Cross the Line Campaign")

Violence against women is a community issue that impacts not only on the health and wellbeing of the women subjected to violence, but on their children, families, workplaces and communities and adds a huge burden to our economy, law enforcement and health care systems.
